Position Context/Purpose

La Trobe Sport is a business unit within La Trobe University tasked with the strategic goal of developing La Trobe to be the University of choice for Sport in Australia.

La Trobe Sport oversees sports related facilities and grounds, and drives sport related programs and partnerships, to ultimately enrich a student's time at the University through sport. The business unit collaborates across the University with sport related academics and other departments to support and enable, the best sport-related teaching and research, as well as student participation in sport and recreation. La Trobe Sport also oversees the active engagement of the wider community in the campus through the use of its sporting facilities and sport services.

The primary purpose of this position is to work with the Commercial Programs Manager, La Trobe Sport, to expand and deliver excellent sport and active recreation community programs including outstanding customer experience across La Trobe Sport facilities.

Duties at this level will include:

- 1. Under broad supervision of the Commercial Programs Manager, implement the delivery of key community participation programs.
- 2. Identify and action participation targets and growth outcomes of the School Holiday Programs, Children's Birthday Parties, Active Recreation School & Community programs, including Diversity and Inclusion Programs.
- 3. Work closely with the Regional Sports Coordinator to activate the regional action plan for community engagement programs including, holiday programs, birthday parties and integrate diverse communities including schools into participation programs.
- 4. Liaise, communicate, and build effective professional relationships with internal and external departments, organisations and stakeholders to drive visibility and increase demand of active recreation community programs across a broad range of users.
- 5. Identify and review process and program changes that contribute to improved efficiencies, safety, and satisfaction. This will include collaboration with other La Trobe Sport business units, including Facilities & Operations, Marketing and Customer Experience.
- 6. Facilitate end-to-end bookings and program administration for all dry program enquiries. Including but not limited to responding to queries, providing quotes, confirming bookings, creating access schedules, ensuring facilities are prepared and programs are appropriately staffed.
- 7. Supervise the activities of front-line dry-programs team to ensure the facilitation of safe and engaging active recreation programs. This includes but is not limited to, recruitment and onboarding, staff training and development, maintenance of rostering and payroll systems.
- 8. Under broad supervision of the Senior Operations Coordinator, maintain rock climbing wall operations, including training requirements and inductions of casual program leaders.
- 9. Undertake regular risk management reviews of activities, tasks and functions, including policies and procedures specific to community programs.
- 8. Carry out other duties as required by the Commercial Programs Manager, La Trobe Sport.

Key Selection Criteria

ESSENTIAL

- 1. Relevant undergraduate qualifications in sport management, sport and exercise science or related fields; or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and education/training.
- 2. Relevant knowledge and experience in the delivery of active recreation programs in community participation and education sectors.
- 3. Ability to undertake assessment of community and stakeholder needs and implement new initiatives and programs in response.

- 4. Proven ability to lead, support and engage a team of front-line staff and proven ability to deliver excellent customer service.
- 5. Ability to adapt to change, balance workload and remain effective when faced with challenging tasks, responsibilities, or people.
- 6. Demonstrated knowledge and experience in ensuring compliance and management of risk, specific to the delivery of safe and engaging active recreation programs.
- 7. A positive and proactive approach to work, including the willingness to get hands on and upskill as required.

Capabilities required to be successful in the position:

- Knowledge of own strengths, weaknesses and biases modifying behaviour, based on selfreflection and feedback, to respond to others with empathy and act on feedback to improve knowledge, skills and behaviour.
- Ability to work collaboratively, demonstrate inclusivity and tailor communication in a way that is meaningful to the audience consistently modelling accountability, connectedness, innovation and care.
- Demonstrated creative and critical thinking, ability to generate ideas to solve local problems and recommend improvements to current work practices.
- Ability to make sense of data to inform decision making implementing ideas to improve local practices.
