Your work area

The PERTH (Plastic Exposure Reduction Transforms Health) Trial team is situated within the UWA Medical School, based at the QEII Medical Centre campus. The PERTH trial team are investigating the health effects of plastic associated chemicals (PAC) which humans are exposed to through diet, use of personal care products, and inhalation of air. The study involves a 1-year interventional clinical trial to investigate the effects of plastic-associated chemicals (PAC) on cardiometabolic outcomes. The study is supported by an interdisciplinary team of clinicians, nurses, doctors, medical scientists, dietitians, and statisticians.

Your role

As the appointee you will, under general direction, contribute to the planning, implementation, and coordination of the study activities. You will be a key member of the clinical team recruiting participants and conducting dietary assessments. In addition, you will plan, coordinate, and oversee the procurement and supply of food, and other supplies for the intervention study. You will provide educational support to participants during the intervention, and be part of the wider clinical team, to ensure continuity of care.

Your key responsibilities

Undertake participant recruitment activities and participant management

Liaise with primary produce providers, and other stakeholders involved in supplying products to be used in the intervention study to ensure the smooth operation of the trial

Perform computer-assisted dietary intake assessments, and collect study-related data according to the study protocol, with adherence to GCP guidelines

Perform accurate entry of dietary intake data and management of organised datasets

Follow standard operating procedures to supply products to participants, and participate in contingency planning

Provide one on one support to participants, and respond to enquiries using judgement and initiative during the intervention

Work closely with the wider clinical team to ensure participants have a sufficient supply of food and other products according to the protocol during the intervention

Apply procedures to ensure delivery of a high quality, safe and timely service to research participants

Utilise information systems and databases according to SOPs and the protocol

Participate in trial auditing activities and the preparation of research reports, manuscripts and presentations

Attend study meetings as required
