Broad Purpose of the Position

The Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist is an experienced clinician who applies significant clinical and leadership expertise to the development, delivery and continuous improvement of quality Speech Pathology services appropriate to the rural and remote context. Operating within a multi-disciplinary service context, the Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist upholds professional standards and provides complex clinical and consultancy Speech Pathology services across the region. As a clinical leader, mentor and clinical supervisor the Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist provides clinical support and profession-specific supervision to less experienced Speech Pathologists and plays a leadership role in the clinical education of staff and professional students within the region.

The Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist also plays a leadership role in the RMCLHN Speech Pathology Network, collaborates with other Clinical Seniors to actively promote and contribute to research and evaluation to inform improvements in clinical practice, and holds a portfolio on behalf of Country Health SA. As part of this portfolio responsibility, the Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist is required to develop, nurture and promote increased expertise and service improvements in the portfolio area, to represent RMCLHN on relevant committees, and may be required to contribute to or manage relevant projects.

The Clinical Senior Speech Pathologist is line managed by the Operational Manager, Allied Health, receives clinical support and supervision from the Advanced Clinical Lead Speech Pathologist, and maintains cooperative working relationships with other Allied Health Professional Clinical Seniors, local team members and key stakeholders in the Region and State.

Qualifications

Must hold a recognised qualification within Speech Pathology profession, and be eligible for full membership of Speech Pathology Australia (SPA).

As a self-regulated progression, it is desirable to participate in Speech Pathology Australia's Professional Self-Regulation (PSR) program.

- NPCs must be renewed every 3 years thereafter from date of issue.
- WWCCs and NDIS Worker Screening Checks must be renewed every 5 years thereafter from date of issue.
- Will be required to comply with the requirements of the RMCLHN Procedure for Credentialing Allied Health and Scientific Health Professionals
- Appointment is subject to immunisation risk category requirements (see page 1). There may be ongoing immunisation requirements that must be met.
