Position Summary

We are seeking to appoint a Lecturer in Logistics and Supply Chain Management in the <u>Australian Maritime</u> <u>College</u> which is part of the <u>College of Sciences and Engineering</u>.

The Lecturer in Logistics and Supply Chain Management is a teaching intensive position. The position will involve teaching and scholarship, consultancy, and administrative duties as a Lecturer at the Australian Maritime College as part of the College of Sciences and Engineering. Teaching duties include conducting lectures, tutorials, workshops, seminars, associated assessments, and research supervision for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The appointee will be required to participate in the coordination, design, development, implementation, and review of modern and innovative programmes, flexible delivery and assessment.

The appointee will undertake administrative duties within the CMLM, if appropriate, the wider University. The appointee will also be expected to actively engage in scholarly, research and professional activities appropriate to their discipline and depending on their level, conduct supervision of Honours and Research Higher Degree students.

What You'll Do

- Make an effective and sustained contribution to the University in achieving its strategic objectives and fulfilling its operational responsibilities.
- Coordinate and/or conduct lectures, tutorials, workshops and excursion at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, both on-campus and distance/online, in logistics and supply chain related areas.
- Undertake marking and assessment associated with the units in which the academic teaches, including
 providing feedback and consultation with students and completion of student administration processes.



- Develop new units related to technology applications in logistics and supply chain management.
- Initiate, develop, and monitor innovative and flexible delivery and assessment programmes using modern educational strategies; and collaborate with internal and external partners and clients in delivering these programmes within AMC, locally, interstate, and international.
- Collaboration with outside professional bodies, industry, and the community, with emphasis on meeting stakeholder requirements, maintaining industry and professional links, and providing commercial work, applied research and consultancy within the maritime and logistics related industries, both in Australia and overseas.
- Undertake administrative and management functions to CMLM, and participate in activities such as workshops, seminars, meetings, student recruitment, marketing and promotion activities, and student counselling.
- Undertake other duties as assigned by the Director of CMLM.

What We're Looking For (success criteria)

- Completion of a PhD in a relevant discipline.
- Able to teach in units related to logistics and supply chain field, such as warehousing and distribution management, e-Commerce logistics management, project management
- Evidence of knowledge and/ or experience in the application of emerging technologies (e.g., Industry 4.0) in maritime, logistics and supply chain management
- Evidence of an ability to engage in scholarly research (as indicated by publication record), supervision of Honours and Research Higher Degree students, and participation in application for grants.
- Demonstrated ability to plan and teach effectively at all levels using modern, innovative, and relevant pedagogic tools and strategies.
- Demonstrated ability in well-developed written and oral communication skills and an ability to communicate with a broad cross section of maritime and logistics industry personnel.
- Demonstrated ability to work as part of a team with limited supervision to demanding timelines, an ability to answer and respond to industry and stakeholder inquiries, ability to produce good quality reports, and be flexible with the work.
