Primary Purpose:

Provide a consultant role in Radiation Oncology Services.

Provide inpatient and outpatient care to public and private patients of the Royal Hobart Hospital in Radiation Oncology Services.

Be involved in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, and to be actively involved in research.

Undertake quality improvement activities.

Duties:

I. Patient Care:

- Provide Consultant Service to inpatients, and admit patients under their care.
- Conduct or direct out-patient clinics in Radiation Oncology Services.
- Participate in quality assurance programs for the Radiation Oncology Services.
- Participate in an After Hours Consultants On call Roster for Radiation Oncology Services.

2. Teaching:

- Participate in undergraduate and postgraduate specialist trainee teaching.
- Liaise with the University of Tasmania, Department of Medicine in respect to the teaching of undergraduates.

3. Research:

Maintain an active involvement in research.

4. Management:

- Responsible to the Head of Radiation Oncology Services.
- Liaison with the University of Tasmania's Department of Medicine on issues relating to undergraduate teaching and research.
- 5. The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying positions at this classification level.

Key Accountabilities and Responsibilities:

Provide a high quality service under the direction of the relevant clinical service head to patients of Royal Hobart Hospital by:

- Providing appropriate clinical care to patients;
- Coordinating the follow up care of patients;
- Attending inpatients rounds and consulting clinics as scheduled;
- Contributing to an after-hours on-call service in accordance with a roster;
- Ensuring effective communication with care providers, especially General Practitioners, to promote continuity of patient care.





Demonstrate a commitment to continuous service improvement by:

- Participating in the development of clinical guidelines and protocols.
- Attending and participating in clinical and departmental meetings;
- Participating in departmental peer review and audit activities;
- Continuously reviewing existing practices and promoting change where required;
- Participating in quality improvement programs undertaken by the Royal Hobart Hospital;
- Participating in College-based programs directed towards maintaining the highest standards of professional care; and
- Participating in personal performance appraisal.

Demonstrate a commitment to personal and professional development by:

- Attending conferences to maintain and enhance knowledge;
- Participating in programs designed to provide personal growth and development.

Demonstrate a commitment to the provision of a multidisciplinary approach to clinical care by:

- Working harmoniously with all members of the clinical team;
- Being responsive to the expectations and needs of both clinical and non-clinical colleagues.

Engender a consumer focus in service delivery by:

- Ensuring consumers are able to exercise their rights and responsibilities;
- Ensuring that patients and families are given adequate information upon which to base treatment decisions and follow up;
- Being responsive to complaints from patients and their relatives; and
- Demonstrating empathy for patients and their families.

Provide appropriate support, direction and training to trainee medical officers, nurses and medical students by:

- Providing appropriate direction and supervision to Registrars, Resident Medical Officers and Nurses;
- Acting as a role model and mentor for trainee medical staff, nurses and medical students; and
- Participating in the education of trainee medical staff, nurses and medical students.

Participate in and contribute to the academic life of the Department by:

- Conducting research;
- Participating actively in postgraduate educational activities e.g. Grand Rounds; and
- Contributing to the supervision of postgraduate students.

Promote and contribute to the maintenance of a safe working environment by:

- Complying with occupational health, safety and welfare policies and other written arrangements for occupational health, safety and welfare at work;
- Participating in relevant occupational health, safety and welfare programs;





- Complying with any reasonable instruction and following safe-work practices in relation to occupational health, safety and welfare at work;
- Participating in training programs and on the job training programs for occupational health, safety and welfare;
- Reporting all incidents, accidents and observed hazards to their supervisor or manager as soon as possible
 and assisting in the investigation process;
- Supporting the role of the health and safety representatives by keeping them informed of any issues relating to health, safety and welfare in the workplaces;
- Ensuring that you are not, by the consumption of alcohol or a drug, in such a state as to endanger their own health, safety at work or the health and safety or any other person;
- Participating in appraisals to evaluate OHS performance;
- Championing a child safe culture that upholds the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations. The Department is committed to the safety, wellbeing, and empowerment of all children and young people, and expect all employees to actively participate in and contribute to our rights-based approach to care, including meeting all mandatory reporting obligations;

Pre-employment Conditions:

Selection Criteria:

- I. Significant experience of providing in-patient and Radiation Oncology Services care to the standard of a tertiary referral teaching hospital.
- 2. Sound knowledge of the national and state health policy framework impacting on health service delivery in Tasmania generally and on the Hospital as a tertiary provider in particular.
- 3. Demonstrated capacity to undertake undergraduate and postgraduate teaching.
- 4. Ability to undertake and manage research activities.
- 5. Ability to communicate effectively and maintain good interpersonal relationships.
- 6. Knowledge of contemporary practices and recent advances in relevant medical area.
