As Associate Professor the role teaches across two or more of the following areas: the fundamentals of management, strategic management, organisational behaviour, HRM, managerial ethics, or leadership; and provides leadership to the School, College, University, and external environment through a commitment to a 'place based' focus to service and engagement.

The appointee meets the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) requirements of a Scholarly Academic demonstrating an established track record and continuation of high-quality, industry relevant, discipline or teaching-related research.
