OVERVIEW OF RELEVANT AREA AND POSITION SUMMARY

UNSW Medicine is a national leader in learning, teaching and research, with close affiliations to a number of Australia's finest hospitals, research institutes and health care organisations. With a strong presence at UNSW Kensington campus, the faculty have staff and students in teaching hospitals in Sydney as well as regional and rural areas of NSW including Albury/Wodonga, Wagga Wagga, Coffs Harbour and Port Macquarie.

The School of Public Health and Community Medicine (SPHCM) is internationally recognised as a leader in Public Health with research strengths in Health Systems Research, Adolescent Health, Healthy Ageing, Infection and Immunity, Environmental Health, Global Health, Indigenous Health and Primary Health Care. Our work generates new knowledge to help inform policy, governance, organisation, work and leadership in the health sector through cross disciplinary research with both academia and industry. The School also has strong associations with research centres and institutes throughout UNSW.

The position of Senior Lecturer will actively develop their chosen program of research in the field of health services; linking to the wider team and supervising high degree research students in their field. The Senior Lecturer will actively pursue external competitive research funding, demonstrate an upward trajectory in the publication of high quality research outputs, and draw upon their research expertise to inform the teaching program.

The Senior Lecturer will have a pivotal role in the educational offerings of UNSW Health Management, which include a large postgraduate Masters, Graduate Diploma and Graduate Certificate Programs, along with the development of bespoke executive education offerings for healthcare leaders and managers nationally and globally.

The role of Senior Lecturer reports to Director of Health Management and has no direct reports.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific responsibilities for this role include:

- Undertake and lead research in Health Services/Healthcare Management including taking a leading role in seeking Category 1 and industry grants, and through the presentation and publication of research findings in high-impact journals.
- Provide supervision of higher degree students in Masters, PhD and DrPH research projects, and of undergraduate medicine students through Independent Learning Projects.
- Develop research collaborations within the School, its associated centres and at national and international levels.
- Contribute to face-to-face and online teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate programs, with a focus on health services and healthcare management.
- Contribute to ongoing curriculum, course and program development and delivery.

- Lead student feedback and evaluation and continual improvement of teaching.
- Maintain relationships with stakeholders internal to UNSW and external (eg Commonwealth and State Governments, collaborating Universities, Divisions and International Organisations).
- Play a leadership and mentoring role in School and Faculty activities and committees.
- Ensure that the work for which they are responsible is carried out in ways, which safeguard the WHS of staff or students in their charge and visitors, including contractors whom they engage.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- PhD degree in health services research or related field
- Demonstrated knowledge and experience in areas of health services research that may include, but are not limited to, patient safety, health economics, healthcare leadership, change management, strategic planning, or health policy
- Demonstrated experience in delivery of quality postgraduate teaching and curriculum development, including high quality online delivery of courses
- Demonstrated track record in research with outcomes of high quality and high international impact with clear evidence of the desire and ability to continually achieve research excellence as well as the capacity for research leadership
- Excellent communication, organisation and presentation skills
- Demonstrated ability to work independently in a goal-directed manner yet collaboratively with other staff and external providers
- Ability and capacity to implement required UNSW health and safety policies and procedures.
