Overview

Provide advice and support services that improve the student experience. Assist the Campus Life Coordinator with the planning, coordinating and provision of programs and support to students living on residences. Helps deliver social engagement, community building, personal development and academic support programs that promote and strengthen a positive, respectful residential community and living and learning experience.

Respond to resident welfare and personal support issues, including identification and referral to other University Services. The position will also contribute to student led and delivered programs, functions and activities such as social, recreational, learning and sporting events within Residential Services and the University.

Reporting to the Coordinator, Campus Life this role will:

- · Follow professional and ethical behaviours in day-to-day activities and interactions.
- · Provide basic, practical and accessible solutions to problems after considering multiple perspectives.
- Consult with available sources to gather relevant information and seek the expertise and advice of other people as appropriate
- Assist in process improvement activities and adopt new ideas, approaches and changes to work practices
- · Deliver effective and efficient outcomes and outputs against team and operational work plans
- Take personal responsibility and show initiative to meeting goals and objectives contributing to an inclusive team environment
- · Work collaboratively within the team by maintaining respectful and effective communication with others.

Accountabilities

- Support team members as needed to deliver against individual, team and University goals and recognise the importance of teamwork and of effective communication amongst team members and build rapport within immediate team in ways that are respectful and inclusive of others.
- Role model professional and ethical behaviours. Consult with available sources to gather relevant information and seek the expertise and advice of other people as appropriate.
- · Clarify expectations and respond promptly to customer requests, queries, or complaints to ensure customer needs are met to agreed standards and timelines and seek to understand the audience by increasing knowledge of a diverse range of communication needs.
- Presents information in a clear and structured way and communicates concisely by focusing on key messages and checks that messages delivered are understood and tailor communication style and message according to audience needs
- Support team members and contribute to maintaining positive relationships with a diverse range of existing stakeholders.
- Take personal responsibility for meeting goals and objectives and for contributing to an inclusive team environment and take an organised and methodical approach to work, regularly plan time (workday / week / month) according to workload and track progress of work tasks.
- Engage in process improvement activities and adopts new ideas, approaches and changes to work practices and deliver effective and efficient outcomes and outputs against team and operational goals.
- Demonstrate initiative by assisting with tasks and contributing feedback and suggestions as needed.

Selection

- · Completion of a Degree without subsequent relevant work experience; or
- · Completion of an Associate Diploma and at least two years subsequent relevant work experience; or
- Completion of a Post-Trades Certificate or Advanced Certificate and extensive relevant experience as a Technician; or
- · An equivalent combination of relevant experience and/or education/training
