Overview

The Lead, Open Education will drive the development of Deakin's open education programs, supporting and providing advice to academic staff on the implementation of open education practices and pedagogies and building the capability of Scholarly Services Librarians to support open education practices. By applying evidence- based approaches the role will contribute to enhancing the quality of student learning experiences and outcomes at Deakin by advancing course-wide adoption of Open Education. Working collaboratively with Scholarly Services Librarians and colleagues in Deakin Learning Futures, the role will lead a small team of Open Education Librarians to provide specialist hands-on support for curriculum and learning design; produce teaching and learning resources and work with teaching teams to embed open practices; and promote the value of open education through communities of practice, Library programs and services as well as your own scholarship.

Accountabilities

Education and Employability

- Lead the development and/or adoption of new innovation in curriculum design within a course and deliver learner-centric, research-informed teaching practices across different levels / modes of delivery.
- · Work collaboratively with other teaching teams to develop effective open education practices and pedagogies learning.
- · Integrate industry, clinical and/or research practice into unit/course design to improve student learning experiences, success, engagement and resources.
- Design collaborative learning opportunities at the course level. Support diverse learners by designing accessible and inclusive unit and course material and practices.
- Foster a culture of collaboration and educational excellence. Build teaching and learning capability and
 effective unit and course teaching teams related to discipline or pedagogy and support the professional
 development of other academics. Conduct mentoring of colleagues to help improve their teaching
 practices.
- · Integrate new pedagogical research across all aspects of education and collaborate with teams to support efforts to secure resources to fund pedagogical research opportunities. Make significant advances in knowledge within their fields/areas of teaching, scholarship and pedagogical research activity.
- Build communities that adopt open practices and lead promotion of open education program. Develop networks and collaborate with university colleagues to determine an approach to extending those networks into more formal alliances.
- Expand and embed the use of OER by overseeing the continued transition and transformation of the university's OER micro-grants scheme to open education affordance, principally focusing on the strategic development of open educational resources and the systems, data and processes to track them.
- · Refine and re-articulate the Library's Open Education approach beyond 2025.
- · Contributing to Library strategic planning.



Research and Innovation

- Demonstrate sustained national and building international reputation, as emerging world leader, based on significant and growing focused body of work, recognised quality, excellence and impact with a sustained and growing track record of timely delivery of outcomes for industry partners.
