- To treat all client related information with respect and confidentiality.
- To be committed, reliable and attend the program on a regular basis.
- To keep the hand care kit and all items clean.
- To monitor stock and have stock replaced as needed.
- To be trained in the Hands On procedures.

- Shows initiative with a common sense approach
- General administration experience
- An interest in providing humanitarian service and to work within the fundamental principles of Red Cross.
