This role will coordinate the Medical School's evaluation functions for all courses and units including the MD program, articulating undergraduate major and postgraduate courses – including assessment methods, feedback and quality assurance.

Key responsibilities

1. Program Evaluation Related Activities

- Responsible for design, development, implementation and administration of MD course, unit and discipline level evaluation in liaison with the Head of the Medical Education Unit, academic and administration staff.
- Undertake analysis of data using statistical packages for the purpose of evaluating teaching, learning and assessment of the courses offered by the School.
- Be responsible for the production and dissemination of evaluation reports in a timely manner and follow up on action undertaken to close the evaluation loop.
- Develop School level evaluation procedures in alignment with the Faculty evaluation process and ensure the procedures are followed at unit and course level.
- Be aware of and advise staff on implementation of other UWA evaluation activities.
- Provide staff development on the use of evaluation, including self-evaluation, in conjunction with the Medical Program Committee.
- Undertake library and archival work related to evaluation and educational research data.
- Attend and provide support in program, School and Faculty committee meetings as required.
- Liaise with Faculty and School staff on issues such as evaluation activities and results
- Conduct other evaluation projects as directed by the Head of Medical Education Unit.

2. Research

- Conduct research in collaboration with academic staff and the evaluation committee such as the writing, updating and editing of publications related to evaluation and educational research.
- Initiate and follow through on possible educational or curriculum related research topics for publication and funding purposes.

3. Special and other Projects

 Assist at the direction of the Head of Medical Education Unit in curriculum development and special projects related to the School, Faculty and University priorities.

Post-graduate degree in education or substantial experience in a related field.

Experience in medical education including knowledge of the medical curriculum of UWA. (Desirable)

Experience with the evaluation of course and unit curricula – including methodologies, design and communication to collaborators and stakeholders.

Experience with evaluation applications including databases of assessment questions, surveys and results
