POSITION PURPOSE

A Level D academic is expected to make a significant contribution to all activities of the Department of Architecture and play a significant role within the disciplinary leadership team. Academics at this level may be appointed in recognition of distinction in their disciplinary area.

We seek an individual to provide educational and pedagogic leadership for the Department, in alignment with the Departments existing strengths, as part of the leadership team with Head of Department and Course Leaders. With a distinguished educational, research and practice track record, this person will bring an international reputation and network. The Level D academic will have a demonstrated capacity for program leadership, set against the context of current challenges and opportunities in architectural education. The Level D academic will have the capability to undertake practice-based and traditional research aligned with Monash Urban Lab including multi-scalar design investigations in partnership with community, industry and government.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific duties required of a Level D academic may include:

- 1. The preparation and delivery of lectures, tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, workshops, and clinical sessions
- 2. Initiation and development of course materials
- **3.** Course coordination and course leadership including offering guidance to assistant lecturers and supervision of sessional staff in teaching unit/s if required
- 4. Consultation with students and supervision of PhD, honours and postgraduate students
- 5. Preparation and assessment of student assignments and examinations
- 6. Conduct of original research that will lead to publications in refereed journals or with high level academic or commercial publishers and attract external and government funding

- 7. Significant role in research project including leadership of a research team
- 8. Significant contribution to the profession and/or discipline both nationally and internationally
- 9. Other duties as directed from time to time

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

- **1.** The appointee will have:
 - Professional registration as an architect or urban practitioner, and a doctoral qualification and/or internationally recognised professional practice experience in the relevant discipline area.

In determining experience relative to qualifications, regard shall be had to teaching experience, experience in research, experience outside tertiary education, creative achievement, professional contributions and/or contributions to technical achievement. In addition, a position at this level will normally require a record of demonstrable scholarly and professional achievement in the relevant discipline area.

Knowledge and Skills

- **2.** A strong publication record in high-quality journals or equivalent and outstanding contribution to the discipline of architecture and urbanism
- **3.** Successful track record in obtaining external research grants and/or external enterprise and industry funding
- **4.** Record of successful supervision of postgraduate research students and the ability to make a significant contribution to postgraduate training programs
- **5.** Demonstrated excellence in teaching in the relevant discipline area (i.e. through evaluations, innovation in presentation and through curriculum development)
- 6. Demonstrated ability to mentor staff and students
- 7. High level of interpersonal skills and a proven ability to establish good working relationships with colleagues, students and members of community and professional bodies
- **8.** Demonstrated high level program leadership undertaken within academic institutions, as well as in external committees and other administrative work and portfolios
- **9.** Proven ability to promote the discipline internally within the University as well as externally both nationally and internationally
- 10. A demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff in the workplace
- **11.** Internationally recognised professional practice in architecture, or urban design, and the capacity to generate practice-based research outcomes and external funding
