Focus of Duties:

- Participate and train in the Tasmanian Health Organisation – South Refugee Health service outpatient clinics
- To participate in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching
- To participate in research and quality improvement activities

Duties:

1. Participate in the refugee health outpatient services of the Royal Hobart Hospital by working collaboratively with medical and scientific staff and other health professionals in a role commensurate with experience.
2. Participate in the undergraduate and postgraduate teaching programs of the hospital and university of Tasmania.
3. Ensure accurate and comprehensive clinical records and ensure good communication regarding patient care with any referring units and community practitioners
4. Participate in quality assurance within the hospital.
5. Contribute to hospital educational activities including undergraduate and postgraduate teaching.
6. Participate in research activities.
7. Supervision of residents, interns and medical students as required.

The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying jobs at this classification level.

Scope of Work Performed:

- Responsible for adherence to Hospital and professional protocols, policies, clinical pathways and standards.
- Responsible for demonstrating sound judgement and competence in accordance with skills and knowledge when undertaking tasks.
- Responsible for ensuring work is carried out in accordance with relevant occupational health and safety legislation and procedures.
