POSITION PURPOSE

The Senior Lecturer is expected to make contributions to the teaching and research effort of the University and to carry out activities to develop and maintain scholarly research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline.

The Senior Lecturer (Paramedicine) will contribute to the development and delivery of either undergraduate and/or postgraduate education to students studying into the Bachelor of Paramedicine, Bachelor of Paramedicine (Honours), Master of Specialist Paramedic Practice, Master of Advanced Health Care Practice, or PhD by contributing an area of expertise to these programs and working with other subject matter experts for the effective delivery of these programs. This position will focus on co-ordination and leadership supporting the development and growth of the Department's educational and research programs.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific duties required of a Level C academic may include:

- 1. The conduct of lectures, tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, clinical workshops and simulations
- 2. Initiation and development of subject material
- 3. Course coordination
- 4. The preparation and delivery of lectures and seminars
- 5. Supervision of honours or postgraduate research projects
- 6. The conduct of research
- 7. Significant role in research projects including, where appropriate, leadership of a research team
- 8. Involvement in professional activity
- 9. Consultation with students
- 10. Broad administrative functions
- 11. Marking and assessment
- **12.** Attendance at departmental, school and/or faculty meetings and a major role in planning or committee work
- 13. Other duties as directed from time to time

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The appointee will have:
 - A doctoral or masters qualification in the relevant discipline area or equivalent accreditation and standing. These disciplines might include: paramedicine, medicine, or nursing.

In determining experience relative to qualifications, regard shall be had to teaching experience, experience in research, experience outside tertiary education, creative achievement, professional contributions and/or contributions to technical achievement. In addition, a position at this level will normally require a record of demonstrable scholarly and professional achievement in the relevant discipline area.

Knowledge and Skills

- 2. Possess a high level of interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team across both the education and service sectors
- **3.** Demonstrated publication record in high-quality refereed journals, conferences equivalent textbooks or teaching resources
- 4. Demonstrated ability in undertaking outstanding research and leading a research team and project
- 5. Proven record of obtaining significant external grants for research
- 6. Demonstrated record of successfully supervising postgraduate research students
- **7.** Ability to work positively and cooperatively with students, internal and external teams and external organisations

- 8. Demonstrated strong record of teaching experience in a tertiary environment including course coordination
- 9. Demonstrated ability to motivate, actively engage and educate a given audience
- 10. Proven ability, commitment and passion for engaging in scholarly and research activities
- 11. A demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff in the workplace
