Based in the scenic waterfront area of Hobart, Tasmania, as one of our ED RMOs you'll provide emergency care to patients attending the Emergency Department (ED) at the Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH).

You will be encouraged and supported to learn, grow and develop as a confident junior Doctor. Working as a RHH ED RMO you will be supported by peers and mentors to develop skills and knowledge to gain experience and prior learning recognition towards your chosen career pathway. Whether you choose to continue a career in Emergency Medicine or diversify the skills developed from your time in ED to other critical care Specialities or General Practice, the practical and academic experiences gained whilst working in ED at the Royal Hobart Hospital will empower your future.

RHH ED provide 1.5 hours of protected teaching each week with a curriculum focused on critical care and an abundance of practical experience to develop and expand your knowledge

The Emergency Department provides opportunities for you to gain additional qualifications in Emergency Medicine, such as:

- Emergency Medicine Certificate
- Emergency Medicine Diploma
- An easy transition to Emergency Department - Registrar.
- Fulfilling the Emergency Medicine time to apply for the Australasian College of Emergency Medicine (ACEM).
- International medical graduates (IMGs) on the Standard Pathway will be supported through the Workplace Based Assessment Pathway for completion of AMC clinical (AMC2). IMGs on limited registration may apply to AHPRA for progression to general registration on completion of AMC2 and 47 weeks worked.
- IMGs on the Competent Authority Pathway are eligible to apply for General Registration once successful completion of 47 weeks worked under supervised practice.

You will be joining a department dedicated to the wellbeing of its staff, exemplified by winning the ACEM wellbeing award in 2022 for our numerous wellbeing strategies embedded in our daily work practices.

Living in Tasmania offers a balanced lifestyle. Take advantage of reduced travel times to enjoy activities around rostered shifts; an early morning surf, riding your bike to work or a walk along the beach are just a few of the lifestyle advantages in Southern Tasmania. Tasmania offers spectacular hiking and mountain bike tracks only short drives from the CBD with Café and dining experiences nationally renowned. Our ED roster provides flexibility to maintain a work-life balance. Day and evening shifts are 9.5 hour duration and Night shifts a duration of 10 hours, the rostered hours are spread over the fortnight to enable 6 days off across 14 days. ED roster provides flexibility to incorporate shift requests and paring rosters for joint applicants.

The Emergency Department (ED) provides a tertiary level service for people with illness or injury 24 hours a day 7 days per week. Our busy ED provides care

for >75,000 patients annually with an admission rate of more than 35% and a Paediatric case load of 20%.

The RHH Emergency Department has a co-located Emergency Medical Unit (EMU) which is a short stay ward for patients requiring a brief hospital stay (generally less than 24 hours). EMU has 28 short-stay beds operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with a high turnover ward environment and a variety of clinical presentations.

FACEMs provide direct supervision of the department from 07:00-00:30 7 days a week. A Senior Registrar is in charge overnight with a team of Registrars providing supervision to RMOs and Interns on shift. .

The health demographics of the Tasmanian population means you'll get to work with a greatly differing population, often more unwell, with more advanced pathology. We have a specialised and highly dedicated allied health team based in the ED to ensure alternated pathways to hospital admission are fully utilised.

The RHH ED is a fast-paced and energetic environment and there are opportunities for staff to be involved in a variety of projects, clinical and research opportunities.

Through it all, you will work with a vibrant mix of locals and new Tasmanian adventurers who are all dedicated to making a difference in our state. Tasmania is experiencing a sustained period of growth. Come and be part of an exciting and rewarding place to work where your energy and positive values will contribute to sustained change as we grow. We can't wait to welcome you into our team!
