Position Summary

Specifically, the RCS supports undergraduate exposure to rurally based clinical training for medical students with a goal of increasing the subsequent uptake of rural health careers.

The Clinical Educator is a member of the academic team delivering the integrated rural undergraduate Doctor of Medicine (MD) program (predominantly the last two years of the degree) based at the RCS. The Clinical Educator is responsible for planning and delivering clinical skills and simulation teaching aligned to the medical curriculum and teaching timetable.

- Teach clinical skills to undergraduate medical students across areas of the MD curriculum appropriate to your expertise and qualifications.
- Manage and maintain clinical simulation equipment and consumables.
- Organise and deliver simulation based clinical teaching and assessments in both hospital and off-site rural settings.
- Develop effective clinical learning and teaching strategies based on contemporary evidence and practice.
- Mentor and support rural medical students both at an individual and peer group level to succeed in their



rural medical training pathway.

- Contribute to the development and maintenance of productive interdisciplinary relationships across the College.
- Maintain currency of clinical practice and look for opportunities to continuously improve academic learning and teaching skills.
- Undertake other duties as assigned by the supervisor.

- Current registration as either a medical practitioner or a nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) and a minimum of five years postgraduate clinical and professional experience.

- Demonstrated ability to work both independently and as a member of a team that includes both professional and academic staff

- Demonstrated ability to maintain currency of clinical skills through current practice and/or through professional development.
