Position Summary

We are seeking to appoint an Online Education Coordinator in the <u>Wicking Dementia Research and Education</u> <u>Centre</u>, part of the <u>College of Health and Medicine</u>.

Almost half a million people in Australia are living with dementia, and globally there are nearly 50 million.

The Online Education Coordinator will work to identify and foster relationships, partnerships, and networks to promote the Centre's education and research programs, to increase dementia literacy within Tasmania, interstate and internationally. This role will also oversee delivery of the Centre's online educational programs, including driving new business models for the flagship dementia MOOCs.

What You'll Do

- Coordinate the delivery of the Centre's non-award online education programs, including design, format, structure, delivery, curriculum scheduling, quality assurance, film/editing processes, and related tasks; ensuring that content is contemporary and relevant.
- Develop and cultivate strategic relationships and networks with government, community and industry organisations in the health, aged and dementia care sectors to drive engagement in the Centre's education programs, as well as relevant programs across the broader College of Health and Medicine.
- Lead, oversee and execute business development plans and projects to develop new education products; and drive awareness of and increase participation in existing education programs, and other community engagement and research activities.
- Provide industry insights; undertake environmental analysis of state, national and international health /aged care policy, industry, funding, and competitor environments; and maintain an understanding of education needs within the aged care sector, to inform business development activity.



- Work with colleagues across the University to ensure the delivery of business development activities within the Wicking Centre are aligned to the broader College and University strategy.
- Ensure policy and legislative compliance is maintained with regard to online education programs, in areas including, but not limited to data, privacy, IP, talent-release, ethics and terms and conditions.
- Undertake other duties as assigned by the supervisor.

- A degree qualification in a relevant field, or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and / or education / training.
- Demonstrated success in business development, project management, reporting and maintaining records and systems.
- An understanding of, or willingness and ability to learn about, online education products and programs.
- Demonstrated capacity to identify, develop, maintain and nurture internal and external stakeholder relationships and/or partnerships.
- Advanced skills in business case development and implementation.
- High-level written and oral communication skills, with strong evidence of achieving significant business outcomes through the articulation and presentation of innovative ideas and solutions, and through negotiation.
- An understanding of, or willingness and ability to learn about, the aged care and/or health sector in Australia.
- Demonstrated experience working as part of a broader team.
