Raise awareness about the research project in the community and support the team in recruiting participants

Maintain relationships with organisational referral sources

Conduct information sessions to explain the research projects to potential participants and health service providers

Facilitate and support older participants to attend and take part in twice weekly DAMPAA healthy lifestyle sessions

Deliver healthy lifestyle and falls prevention education to participants

Motivate participants to complete ACCHS and home based sessions

Conduct regular cardiovascular and metabolic health reviews and monitoring

Obtain consent and refer participants on for medical review, services and support as required

Maintain participant health records as per the standard operating procedures

Undertake data entry
