Primary Purpose:

In accordance with department policies and procedures, maintain a high standard of cleaning in areas across Hospitals South including removal of garbage and collection/distribution of linen.





Duties:

- 1. Perform general cleaning duties including floor and wall maintenance in offices, wards, corridors, toilet blocks and other designated areas throughout the health facility as directed.
- 2. Undertake a variety of cleaning tasks and other related duties including removal of garbage and collection/distribution of linen.
- 3. Ensure safe manual handling techniques are used in the operation of equipment and report any faults, in a timely manner, to enable corrective action to be taken.
- 4. Actively participate in and contribute to the organisation's Quality & Safety and Work Health & Safety processes, including in the development and implementation of safety systems, improvement initiatives, safeguarding practices for vulnerable people, and related training.
- 5. The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying positions at this classification level.

Key Accountabilities and Responsibilities:

- Ability and willingness to work in all areas of Environmental Services in various capacities as required.
- Responsible for maintaining a high standard of hygiene and cleanliness in ward and ancillary areas in accordance with established policies, standards and guidelines.
- Receive direction and instruction from Environmental Services and Quality Supervisors.
- Ensure a caring and courteous manner is shown towards patients, visitors, staff and members of the public.
- Responsible for maintaining patient confidentiality.
- Champion a child safe culture that upholds the *National Principles for Child Safe Organisations*. The Department is committed to the safety, wellbeing, and empowerment of all children and young people, and expect all employees to actively participate in and contribute to our rights-based approach to care, including meeting all mandatory reporting obligations.
- Where applicable, exercise delegations in accordance with a range of Acts, Regulations, Awards, administrative authorities and functional arrangements as mandated by Statutory office holders including the Secretary and Head of State Service. The relevant Unit Manager can provide details to the occupant of delegations applicable to this position.
- Comply at all times with policy and protocol requirements, including those relating to mandatory education, training and assessment.

Pre-employment Conditions:

It is the Employee's responsibility to notify an Employer of any new criminal convictions during the course of their employment with the Department.

The Head of the State Service has determined that the person nominated for this job is to satisfy a pre-employment check before taking up the appointment, on promotion or transfer. The following checks are to be conducted:

1. Conviction checks in the following areas:





- a. crimes of violence
- b. sex related offences
- c. serious drug offences
- d. crimes involving dishonesty
- 2. Identification check
- 3. Disciplinary action in previous employment check.

Selection Criteria:

- 1. Demonstrated knowledge and experience of cleaning in a large and/or commercial environment.
- 2. Good communication skills with the proven ability to understand both written and verbal instructions and cooperate effectively with other personnel in the workplace.
- 3. Awareness of, and familiarity with, equipment currently in use within the commercial cleaning industry.
- 4. A basic knowledge of cleaning procedures and solutions.
- 5. Understanding of safe manual handling techniques.
- 6. Ability to work individually or in a team environment contributing positively to team operations and working relationships.
