POSITION SUMMARY

The Education Supports for Children in Care (ESCC)Tutor will provide Education supports to Aboriginal children and young people in care by utilising a culturally informed and trauma-informed approach and ensure to best support young people to reengage with, attend and thrive in their chosen education setting and address gaps in learning with a focus on literacy and numeracy development.

ESCC Tutors will be responsible for providing one-on-one educational assistance and tutoring, advising schools on individual learning needs, and supporting Individual Education Plan, Cultural Support ensures a culturally safe environment and offers additional support to foster learning.

The Tutor will work closely with the ESCC Coordinator to assist with attendance and participation at Student Support Groups (SSG) and ensuring a holistic care-team approach for the young person. The Tutor will engage with the young person to collaborate and undertake assessments, together with the school to measure the individual's performance and outcomes to ensure we achieve the educational objectives and outcomes for the ESCC pilot program.

- Demonstrated ability to develop and implement individualised educational plans.
- Ability to tailor and develop worksheets, workplans and utilisation of educational resources to respond to learning needs
- Experience engaging with education stakeholders and school supports, collaborating to achieve individual student goals and improve literacy and numeracy
- Experience working with young people or children exhibiting challenging behaviours, or school disengagement
- Strong understanding of the education support systems available to young people living in residential care settings and an understanding of strengths-based, trauma informed and therapeutic practice
- Ability to advocate for service intervention and client supports
- Experience working with individuals and groups and identifying underlying issues, working with conflict, assisting people to communicate safely and effectively, working collaboratively with other services and supports

REQUIREMENTS

- A qualified teacher, with a minimum of 2 years classroom experience with children in primary and/or secondary schooling setting.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide tailored education support to young people, including implementing education programs in collaboration with the care team and education and vocational providers.
- Providing academic one-on-one support to students for a minimum of one hour per week, for up to 18 months.
- Support educational needs assessments when required.
- Facilitate improved navigation of education and vocational systems and pathways including alternative education settings.
- Support the teacher and school in understanding the child's traumatic experiences and behaviours and give them the tools to engage the child in class work and activities in a therapeutic way.
- Provide information and guidance for young people in relation to vocational pathways.
- Support referral pathways into other available education supports for young people.
- Support staff with the use and knowledge in re engagement in learning, individualised education plans and with student support group meetings.
- Source and provide culturally strengthening educational and teaching resources and activities to promote learning, positive self-esteem, and pride in Aboriginal culture.
- Provide cultural support for children in the program by helping organise and attend cultural events and activities such as camps and school holidays.
- Support case managers and carers to be empowered to advocate for young people through the education system.
- Provide guidance to ensure the home learning environment is supportive for young people residing in VACCA care settings.
- Participate in regular VACCA Education Working Group meetings, care team meetings and a Community of Practice
- Liaise with schools, educational bodies, service providers and other relevant organisations to coordinate a program of student engagement in education.
- Contribute to the reporting and evaluation of the program to meet the funder's requirements.
