

ABOUT CHARLES STURT UNIVERSITY

Charles Sturt University is Australia's largest regional university. Currently enrolling around 40,000 students from every state and territory and from more than 110 countries around the world, we have an annual turnover of A\$535 million and assets valued at A\$1.4 billion.

Our campuses are located in Albury-Wodonga, Bathurst, Canberra, Dubbo, Goulburn, Orange, Parramatta, Port Macquarie and Wagga Wagga. We also have Study Centres in Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne catering to international students, a specialist centre in Manly, and a Regional University Study Centre in Wangaratta, Victoria.

We have three faculties: Arts and Education; Business, Justice and Behavioural Sciences; and Science. Faculties operate across campuses and are responsible for developing and delivering courses, and conducting research. Schools within these faculties are largely discipline based and carry responsibility for the delivery of subjects.

Internationally, we deliver programs in collaboration with higher education institutions in Europe and Asia. Our 7700 international students hail from 143 different countries, with students enrolled at our campuses in Australia originating from 92 countries. We have over 100 academic partnerships in more than 40 countries facilitating research, course delivery, cultural exchange, student and staff exchange, and a diverse range of other education activities.

With more than 25 years of experience leading and innovating online and distance education

in Australia, Charles Sturt University offers the most comprehensive range of programs of any university or private higher education organisation. More than 320 of our courses (around 85 per cent) are offered through online learning, with over 60 per cent of our students enrolled online.

Charles Sturt University has nurtured a particular commitment to the development of the professions and workplace skills in Australia through work-integrated learning. We are routinely ranked significantly above national and international benchmarks by our graduates for performance in work-integrated learning.

We are committed to expanding higher education opportunities for rural, remote and Indigenous students by providing enhanced local study options in a comprehensive range of professional fields supporting the growth and development of regional labour markets, and conducting research that addresses fundamental issues raised by industry and communities in our regions. The full-time employment rate for our graduates eclipses the national university average, and we will continue to strive to provide opportunities for rural, regional and Indigenous students that would not otherwise have been available.

Charles Sturt University's regional location enables it to make a distinctive national and international contribution to research in fields such as health, food and water security, and environmental sustainability, as well as support national priorities by sustaining and growing critical regional labour markets.

Embedding collaboration with others as a core capability across the university while being a consistently market-oriented organisation.

Charles Sturt University – accredited Employer of Choice

Charles Sturt University was awarded an Employer of Choice for Gender Equality (EOCGE) citation from the Commonwealth Workplace Gender Equality Agency (WGEA) in February 2019.

The WGEA EOCGE citation is designed to encourage, recognise and promote active commitment to achieving gender equality in Australian workplaces.

The EOCGE program aims to recognise leading practice in addition to the compliance standards with the Workplace Gender Equality Act 2012, and participation in the program is voluntary.

The citation is recognition of the hard work we have put in and the great things we do at Charles Sturt University to promote gender equality, over and above that required by legislation.

We achieved this through meeting criteria related to leadership; learning and development; gender remuneration gaps; flexible working and other initiatives to support family responsibilities; employee consultation; preventing sex-based harassment and discrimination; and targets for improving gender equality.

In 2018, the University released its Workplace Gender Equity Strategy 2018 - 2022 and we were also among the first Australian higher education institutions to be awarded the Athena SWAN Bronze Institution Award.

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

The Faculty of Science has more than 9000 students and 500 staff dedicated to advancing scientific knowledge. The faculty delivers flexible and innovative teaching programs designed to produce job-ready graduates for a diverse range of professions. As a leader in strategic and applied research, the faculty aims to enhance and extend scientific knowledge, and train and educate future researchers, as well as provide scientific solutions to current regional, national and global challenges. The staff and students of the faculty achieve their educational and research goals through ethical practice, professional collaboration, industry involvement and a commitment to continual improvement.

The faculty is comprised of a faculty office, eight schools, the Three Rivers University Department of Rural Health, teaching/research laboratories and a number of enterprise activities. The majority of our teaching and research activity is undertaken within the schools. The enterprises include a farm, veterinary clinics, dental clinics and a winery which generate revenue and provide significant learning opportunities for our students. The faculty has access to exceptional facilities to support agriculture and has established research and industry relationships.

Dentistry

The Bachelor of Dental Science program commenced in 2009. This course is offered full-time at Charles Sturt University's Orange campus. Successful completion of the five year program leads to registration as a dental practitioner in Australia.

CSU's dentistry programme focuses on (1) excellence in teaching and research and (2) the training of a rural dental workforce, to provide safe and high quality oral health care for the regional communities.

Clinics

Charles Sturt University's Dental and Oral Health Clinics provide the highest standards of treatment for patients with a variety of dental needs. The facilities are equipped with the latest technology, ensuring our patients receive advanced dental care. Clinics are operated by fully qualified oral health professionals and are situated at Albury-Wodonga, Bathurst, Dubbo, Orange and Wagga Wagga.

THE ROLE

Charles Sturt University is currently seeking expression of interest from applicants interested in working on Orange campus in the School of Dentistry and Health Sciences. Multiple positions are available ranging from associate lecturer to professorial level with discipline expertise in periodontics, prosthodontics, endodontics, orthodontics, oral medicine, paediatric dentistry, special care dentistry and/or oral surgery.

To be a successful candidate you will actively engage in clinical teaching, research and curriculum development in the School of Dentistry and Health Sciences, teaching a range of subjects utilising multiple teaching methods (face to face and online delivery). You will participate in administration and ongoing curriculum development, and progress an active research profile that aligns with the direction of both the university and school.

With specialised field experience and demonstrated education experience within the clinical and academic setting, as a successful candidate you may be appointed as either teaching research or teaching focused, based on your research track record.

To be successful you will have:

- postgraduate qualification relevant to periodontics, prosthodontics, endodontics, orthodontics, oral medicine, paediatric dentistry, special care dentistry and/or oral surgery
- full registration (or eligibility) as a dentist with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA)
- a record of academic achievement relevant to the discipline area, demonstrating a capacity to make an autonomous contribution and/or at a national/international level, in research or professional activity
- experience in teaching and/or clinical teaching
- effective leadership skills (for level C and above).


SEASONS
