The Pillar/Business Unit.

The Production department sits within the Performing Arts pillar and comprises of a team that delivers production services for ACM across Staging, Lighting, Audio, Broadcast, Wardrobe, Stage Management, and Safety/Training to enable the safe and efficient delivery of events across all of our venues and spaces.

The Production Team is responsible for meeting the Trust's strategic aims to:

- 1) undertake a series of events of world significance every year
- 2) Incorporate and promote innovation and style in the development and delivery of our programs, ensuring their relevance to Melbourne, Victoria and Australia
- 3) Develop and utilise all our assets, working across our whole estate externally and internally, and linking the experience of the Arts Centre through to the Bowl
- 4) Grasp the opportunities for arts and culture within the digital sphere
- 5) Have a collaborative approach to working with our partners, seeking to promote the most the most significant achievements possible
- 6) Establish a leading reputation for excellence in theatre technical training, management and leadership.

Your qualifications

- Possess a relevant trade qualification, Diploma or higher at a recognised institution or equivalent extensive experience working within the entertainment industry.
- Basic Riggers licence, Fire Emergency Warden training, Test & Tag ticket, Elevated Work Platform licence, Occupational Health and Safety and 'in house' equipment relevant to the position are preferred.

Your Skills and Experience

- Proven experience with and understanding of current technology, operating systems and applications; and the demonstrated ability to learn and apply new technology and systems, including upgrades and changes, within a reasonable timeframe.
- Knowledge and understanding of the theory involved in lighting concepts, and how to utilise this knowledge to achieve and create specific lighting and artistic effects, as well the contribution to the overall professional effect of the production. Experience is required to be able to apply this knowledge for different situations and venues including outside events and broadcasts
- A general electrical knowledge of wattage, amps, circuit breakers, earthing and three phase wiring. Also, the principles of industry equipment communication protocols and data distribution networks including Ethernet and DMX-512 are essential to be able to patch and connect equipment safely, to select the appropriate wattage for size/intensity requirements, and to know how much power is being loaded on each circuit
- A knowledge and understanding of the technical lighting equipment used in the industry is essential
- Knowledge of the lighting console programming and operation is desirable
- Appropriate communication skills to liaise with presenter staff. Well-developed interpersonal skills are required to resolve issues. This may include a need to convey technical information to people with a non-technical background
- Be able to accurately set up and operate equipment, in regard to specific skills and experience, confidently and without delay
- Strong service ethic and understanding of production and presenter needs
- Demonstrating a clear understanding of "performance" etiquette, including a comprehensive knowledge of theatre traditions, protocol and terminology.
- The ability to work under pressure, to prioritise work and resolve problems quickly and efficiently to ensure daily deadlines are achieved
- An understanding of other technical departments work practices in Production, to ensure smooth delivery of events and services
- Knowledge of all ACM venues and technical facilities and capabilities is desirable

In the role you will

Accountabilities:

- Ensuring OH&S procedures are adhered to and followed by our team and presenters for all performances, events, and activities across the ACM
- Excellent interpersonal skills when dealing with the team, presenters and hirers whilst ensuring the highest level of service and presentation is maintained at all times
- Actively contributing to the success of the Lighting team, and the wider organisation
- Providing technical support, guidance and advice to presenters and hirers in the delivery of the Lighting team's outcomes
- Working collaboratively and as part of team across ACM venues and performance spaces
- Ensure that the audience is delivered consistent and effective lighting, with optimum presentation of lighting design, effect and balance

- Participate in the pre-production, rigging, rehearsal, performance and de-rigging of shows and events in line with presenters requirements
- Provide input into Safe Working Method Statements and Risk Assessments to mitigate risk around the use and operation of technical equipment and show specific processes
- Perform other duties and tasks as directed by supervisors

Decision making:

- Under the broad direction of the Supervisor, Lighting and Senior Technician, Lighting, this role will provide input into decisions of lighting design and realisations to achieve a high standard of event and performance delivery

Working environment/physical requirements:

- General office work from time to time, with a strong emphasis on manual work while maintaining safe OH&S practices is required including outdoor and remote locations when required
- May be required to work at height
- Must be able to lift and carry technical equipment.
- Ability to make quick decisions under pressure.
- Due to the nature of work within the theatre environment this can involve long hours, irregular work patterns & heavy physical work
- Be required to undertake the tasks and requirements detailed in the relevant job task analysis.
- Undertake general office work with a strong emphasis on the use of computers and digital technology.
- Work hours in accordance with your employment type and the ACM Enterprise Agreement 2018.
