This position will provide routine technical advice and undertake the assessment of low complexity development matters relating to land use impacts of development to meet the needs of the community within the Moreton Bay Regional Council area.

- Undertake site inspections and investigations to support the assessment of development applications including resolution of land use issues.

- Engage proactively with key stakeholders to ensure quality service outcomes are achieved.
