#### POSITION SUMMARY

The Research Fellow will contribute to a research program in Forensic Mental Health. This position will play a key role in advancing the career of a forensic mental health clinician by undertaking research in collaboration with the Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network. The position will support the research program led by the Chair of Forensic Mental Health.

The role of Research Fellow will report to the to the Chair of Forensic Mental Health in the School of Psychiatry and has no direct reports.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITIES**

Specific accountabilities for this role include:

- Contribute to the research program in forensic mental health led by the Chair of Forensic Mental Health, in collaboration with Justice Health and Forensic Mental Health Network partners.
- Lead the preparation, research analysis and produce/contribute to conference abstracts and publications for submission to peer-reviewed journals.
- Draft research ethics and research grant applications under supervision.
- Publish and present research results at academic/industry national and international conferences.
- Provide targeted support and mentorship of undergraduate students on research placement.
- Attend relevant departmental and/or faculty meetings.

- Collaborate effectively and maintain strong relationships with relevant researchers within the institution, stakeholders and policy makers and contribute to the teaching program within the field of research expertise.
- Develop proposals for national competitive research grant funding.
- Complete administrative functions primarily connected to area of research.
