The Flinders and Upper North Local Health Network (FUNLHN) is a dynamic and innovative organisation.

About us

The FUNLHN is located approximately four hours north of metropolitan Adelaide and covers a vast geographical footprint of approximately 392,000 square kilometers. Our communities are composed of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, pastoralists, farmers, miners and migrant populations culminating in a range of socio-economic factors that impact upon their health care needs and health service delivery strategies. In recognition of the large proportion of Aboriginal people, all our services have developed a strong focus on Aboriginal partnerships, cultural safety and supportive systems and practices.

We employ approximately 1,100 staff across medical, nursing, allied health, ancillary and administration roles and support approximately 44,000 residents in regional and remote areas of South Australia. Our health facilities are a mix of large hospitals, multi-purpose sites, smaller sites and residential aged care facilities providing a range of integrated inpatient, outpatient, emergency, allied health, mental health, Aboriginal health, community health and aged care services.

The FUNLHN delivers culturally safe and high-quality health care services in collaboration with our consumers, enhanced through research and innovation to improve health outcomes for our communities.

Our Values
