- 5. Understanding the various client context so as to anticipate needs, tailor and improve the service offering, and ensure a high-quality outcome by addressing client feedback and setting clear service standards
- 6. Interpret needs and offer pragmatic, inclusive and sustainable solutions based on research and in alignment with University context, policies and practices
- 7. Manage a small team of industry project managers in order to mentor and support students in delivering projects to a high standard for clients
