Role purpose

You will be matched with an older person in their home or aged care facility who is experiencing feelings of social isolation. Through your ongoing visits, you will build a meaningful friendship, reduce feelings of loneliness and encourage social connections.

Role responsibilities

- Visit one-on-one with an older person on a weekly basis.
- Undertake activities that are of interest to the participant. This this may include listening to music together, playing cards or board games, or simply having a chat. Outings are also possible once ongoing visits are well established.
- Maintain regular communication with the Red Cross Program Officer to discuss your visits.
- Record and submit monthly reports to the Red Cross Program Officer.

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Visit one-on-one with an older person on a weekly basis.
- Undertake activities that are of interest to the participant. This this may include listening to music together, playing cards or board games, or simply having a chat. Outings are also possible once ongoing visits are well established.
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Check requirements

 A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Red Cross volunteer induction, program training and matching with a participant during business hours as required

General conditions
