Role purpose

The Townsville Wellbeing Centre is 20 room accommodation service that provides safe and affordable accommodation to patients and their carers travelling from rural and remote Queensland to access specialist medical services that are not available in their local community. The position is responsible for gardening within the Centre and Community Garden

Role Responsibilities

- Provide gardening as required by Centre Coordinator
- Various gardening activities including; planting, watering, weeding, mulching and maintaining garden beds and harvesting produce
- Participating in planning and coordination of community garden
- Cleaning and returning garden tools to storage at the end of each session.
- Liaising with other volunteers, staff and community members
- Participating in volunteer team meetings and
- Tend to and maintain the laying hens and the coop within the Centre and Community
 Garden as required by the Centre Coordinator

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Horticultural or gardening knowledge
- Ability to use initiative and work in a safe manner with minimum supervision.
- Ability to communicate with a diverse cross section of the community, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

Check requirements

A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every five years (Red Cross will arrange this)

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
