Our undergraduate programs include majors offered in the Bachelor of Arts (literary studies, creative writing, children's literature, and gender and sexuality studies) and our main specialist degrees: the Bachelor of Communication (Advertising, Digital Media, Journalism, and Public Relations); the Bachelor of Creative Arts (Dance, Drama, Photography and Visual Arts); the Bachelor of Creative Writing; the Bachelor of Design (3D Animation, Digital Technologies, and Visual Communication); and the Bachelor of Film, Television and Animation.

Our well-established postgraduate programs (Master of Communication, Master of Arts Writing and Literature, Master of Creative Arts) continue to grow in strength and scope; a new master's degree in Film and Television will commence in 2020.

The School operates at the Burwood campus in Melbourne, and at both the Waurn Ponds and Waterfront campuses in Geelong. Our online Cloud campus is a strength, and staff are skilled in delivery through fully online and blended learning. We are blessed with a diverse study cohort, including students from many countries, at both undergraduate and postgraduate level. We have educational partnerships in China, Indonesia, Malaysia, Norway, and Vietnam. Open to both school leaving students and non-school leavers, we have an inclusive and welcoming approach to student recruitment and consistently rank highly for our student experience, graduate outcomes, and overall satisfaction.

Social and creative partnerships are a feature of working in SCCA, with staff actively engaged in developing activities with Toombak Productions, Melbourne Arts Centre, Federation Square, Country Press Association, the Women's National Basketball League, Geelong Writers' Festival, Geelong Performing Arts Centre and more. The School of Communication and Creative Arts seeks an excellent academic to join the Communication group in a continuing role. The appointee will undertake key leadership roles in our undergraduate and postgraduate programs and will be a strong contributor to our research in Communication and Journalism Studies.

You will be a well-qualified academic, with a strong research performance, including generating external research grant income, and a proven ability to work with colleagues in course design and leadership. Your initial focus will be in teaching in the Bachelor of Communication and the Master of Communication, and you will be expected to take on a leadership role in the Communication group and/or the school by 2022.

You will be joining the school at an exciting time, as we expand our degrees in Communication and develop a new research initiative in Global Digital Publics and continue to embed state-of-the-art facilities in our teaching program. You will be expected to contribute to and/or lead teaching across a range of units at undergraduate and postgraduate level, with an initial emphasis on teaching units in **Journalism**.

You will contribute research activity aligned with the Global Digital Publics initiative. The position is based at the Melbourne (Burwood) campus; online teaching through Deakin's cloud campus is also required. The successful applicant will be expected to commence at Deakin no later than Feb 2020 and may be able to commence sooner.
