Position Summary

The School of Psychological Sciences at the University of Tasmania is growing the mental health work force for Tasmania. The School has embarked on exciting changes to our program, aimed at making training for generalist and clinical psychologists accessible across the state. We are searching for academic Clinical Psychologists, who will join this journey that will provide much needed support for the growing demand on the Tasmanian mental health work force.

The University of Tasmania is building a vision of a place-based University with a mission to enhance the intellectual, economic, social and culture future of Tasmania, and from Tasmania, contribute to the world in areas of distinctive advantage. The University recognises that achieving this vision is dependent on the people we employ as well as creating a people-centered University that is values-based, relational, diverse, and development-focused.

We are seeking to appoint a Lecturer in Clinical Psychology in the <u>School of Psychological Sciences</u> which is part of <u>the College of Health and Medicine</u>.

A Lecturer in Clinical Psychology will have knowledge, competency, teaching and supervision experience in a range of clinical topics at postgraduate and undergraduate level, including Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), professional ethics, psychological assessment, and psychopathology. The appointee will be expected to contribute to face-to-face, blended and online delivery of teaching. They will also engage in research supervision, aligned with the College of Health and Medicine's research themes. In addition, the appointee will have a significant role in the development and implementation of a new curriculum in the postgraduate program which aligns with both the 2019 Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) standards and the University of Tasmania postgraduate course structures. This is a teaching focused position, nominally based on the Hobart Campus, however, the School is open to positions being based at our Launceston or Cradle Coast campuses. The incumbent may be required to contribute to teaching, research, supervision and administration on other campuses.

- Contribute to the supervision of provisional psychologists as they undertake their placements in the University Psychology Clinic, or external placements as required. Supervision would include supervising therapy and/or assessment sessions.



- While a teaching focused position, the appointee will be expected to contribute to the high-quality research efforts of the School, for example through contributing to supervision of research students (honors and masters) and helping with research projects in the clinic.
- Contribute to the development and maintenance of productive and effective links inside the University and locally and nationally with the discipline, relevant interdisciplinary domains, profession, industry and/or wider community.
- Make a meaningful contribution to the University's values driven culture by contributing to the

- A PhD in Psychology or equivalent (for example, Clinical Psychology and supervision experience).
- Demonstrated experience in University-level teaching and learning including Postgraduate Psychology.
- Demonstrated ability to develop and implement scholarly and innovative approaches to teaching and learning, including blended and online educational approaches.
- Current registration as a Psychologist in Australia with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency, and Clinical Psychology Area of Practice Endorsement with no conditions, undertakings or reprimands
- Current Psychology Board of Australia Approved Supervisor Status, with approval to supervise
 provisional psychologists during an accredited higher degree program
- Knowledge of, and ability to apply, Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) accreditation standards to curriculum development and implementation
- A commitment to impactful research that has worthwhile contributions to the field of Psychological Sciences, demonstrated by a record of quality publications and presentations at conferences.
- A record of contributing to building and maintaining effective and productive links locally and nationally with the discipline, profession, industry (where relevant) and wider community.
- A good record of working collaboratively within a team to achieve a common goal and display the ability to work in a manner that aligns with the University's values.
