The <u>Institute for Positive Psychology and Education (IPPE)</u> includes some of the most frequently cited researchers in the world such as Professors Herbert Marsh and Richard Ryan. IPPE conducts multidisciplinary research to address educational and psychosocial issues, translate theory and research into effective policy and practice, and demonstrate how individuals, communities, and organisations flourish and thrive.

RESEARCH FOCUS

IPPE produces high-quality empirical education research on the factors that allow humans to flourish and in so doing contribute to their community and society at large. IPPE includes leading international scholars in self-concept, Self-Determination Theory, motivation, expectancy-value theory, and wellbeing research.

IPPE's education research program includes research with a focus on education interventions and randomized control trials as well as the use of statistical methods applied to large-scale longitudinal or cross-country survey data. Current education research areas include but are not limited to: data driven research that enables children and youth to attain positive educational and life outcomes; strengthening teaching and learning; understanding human motivation and behaviour for the promotion of human wellness; enabling staff, student, and parent wellbeing; Indigenous education; and education interventions in teaching and learning. The development of new statistical approaches to advance education research and better address questions of human flourishing is also a major aim of the program.
