- Provide specialist support services and advice to researchers and staff on topics including but not limited to scholarly publishing, research impact, reference management and developing search strategies for systematic reviews.
- Collaborate in the evaluation and development of the Library's information resources and collections in assigned areas to ensure that they meet the learning, teaching and research needs of the University.
- Participate in the investigation, development, implementation and evaluation of innovative digital services and technologies to support the learning, teaching and research of the University.
- Actively contribute to and participate in a positive team environment through planning, staff meetings and professional development activities to achieve the University's strategic initiatives.
- Work towards becoming a critical, evidence-based, and reflective practitioner.

- 4. Demonstrated experience in developing educational resources and materials with the knowledge and understanding of pedagogy and student learning outcomes for delivery in a virtual or face to face environment.
- 5. Excellent communication skills with demonstrated ability to engage, collaborate and build partnerships with a range of stakeholders.
- 6. Sound knowledge in a relevant discipline; and/or experience providing library services for one or more disciplines.
