Role purpose

With a focus on individuals, groups and communities in vulnerable situations, volunteers provide fresh produce and pantry items to people at no cost who are homeless, socially disadvantaged or on very low incomes. The Team Member Volunteer is required to have excellent communication skills and an understanding and empathy for people from diverse backgrounds, at all times behaving in a completely impartial and non-judgmental manner.

Role responsibilities

- Turn up and be on time for your rostered shift (9am-12pm Thursday)
- Be able to complete a minimum of one shift per month
- Distribute fresh produce and pantry items to all clients
- ⁻ Ensure all sections of the Meal Connect questionnaire is completed accurately during the service
- Ensure any remaining boxes of produce is brought back, stored in the depot and vehicle is clean
- Act in accordance with Australian Red Cross and Meal Connect guidelines at all times

Knowledge, skills and experience

- The genuine desire to assist with a service for people in vulnerable situations within the community in a non-judgmental manner
- Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to work closely with others
- Understanding and respect for Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander and other cultures
- Experience working in a similar or related role

Check requirements

- A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)
- Valid "C" class license

Learning and development

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- ⁻ Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required

General conditions

We are a Child Safe organisation and all volunteers are required to comply with relevant State and Territory legislation requirements

We comply with the Red Cross Workplace Health and Safety management system

We may be required to assist the organisation on occasion, in times of national, state or local emergencies or major disasters
