POSITION SUMMARY

The Black Dog Institute is a Medical Research Institute affiliated with UNSW Sydney, and a global leader in translational mental health research. We harness the latest technology and other tools to quickly turn our world-class research findings into clinical services, education and e-health products that improve the lives of people with mental illness and the wider community.

As part of The Australian Government response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Health awarded the Black Dog Institute funding to develop and launch an e-health based solution to support the wellness and mental health of frontline workers. The Essential Network (TEN) launched in June 2020 and provides healthcare workers to an e-health hub with advice and resources for anxiety, depression and PTSD via automated and blended digital care. TEN offers an online clinical triage and initial mental health assessment, referral to face to face specialists, consultation and telehealth appointments, peer support, and discrete self-help pathways. The Prevention Hub will assist in solidifying collaborations with professional bodies and testing the applicability of blended services beyond COVID-19.

The Postdoctoral Fellow will assist with the development, implementation, and evaluation of blended digital and telehealth mental health support for frontline healthcare workers. This will form one part of a larger program of research and implementation into mental health care for this population. The Post-Doctoral Fellow will be responsible for leading the research-related activities relating to design and implementation of the evaluation study, identifying opportunities for collaboration and funding and assisting the broader team with other research related duties.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

Specific accountabilities for this role include:

- Contribute to developing and implementing an evaluation and implementation study of The Essential Network for health professionals, digital and face-to-face services designed to support frontline healthcare workers during COVID-19 and beyond.
- Prepare ethics submissions and annual reports, including budgets and consent forms.
- Assist in the preparation of manuscripts, abstracts, posters and grant/fellowship applications as appropriate.
- Liaise with the study coordinators and stakeholders including government agencies, researchers and collaborators of the various projects.
- Consult with staff on the preparation of grant applications and reports for publication, progress and annual reports for projects and grants and literature searches.
- Conduct data analysis for publications and oversee data management for key projects.
- Perform other duties as requested by your supervisor.
