Role purpose

Supporting the Red Cross Roadhouse program to provide meals to the homeless and disadvantaged six days a week.

Role responsibilities

- Prepare the room for service by setting up tables, chairs and the drink station
- Basic food preparation including handling sharp knives
- Serving meals to patrons
- Cleaning up at the end of the shift and packing away tables and chairs
- Working in a small team to achieve tasks
- Report any incidents in relation to the patron's health, welfare or wellbeing, to Red Cross staff
- Maintain confidentiality of information obtained during a shift unless this information must be disclosed to Red Cross to assist the patron
- Maintain accurate records of number of plates served and the temperature log
- Notify Red Cross in advance if unable to make an allocated shift

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Show empathy for homeless and disadvantaged patrons
- Comfortable having contact with people with severe mental illness and drug and alcohol issues
- Team work skills with volunteers from a diverse range of backgrounds Basic food preparation and cleaning

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
