## Who we are

The Rural Support Service (known as the RSS) is a business unit in SA Health that provides more than 90 clinical and business-related services and functions throughout regional South Australia, partnering with and supporting its six regional local health networks (LHNs).

We offer a fulfilling and supportive work environment focused on innovation, flexibility and responsiveness.

Our work centres around advocating for the health priorities of regional South Australians by collaborating with regional LHNs or providing services direct to people living in rural and remote areas of our state. This involves providing leadership and expertise in clinical and wellbeing services, including digital health and innovation, Aboriginal health, regional workforce planning and development. We also provide expertise in and have jobs across many other functions such as risk, governance, financial services, industrial relations, organisational development, project management, activity based funding and work health safety – and many more.

Services we provide to the regional LHNs and their consumers cover aged care and disability, regional cancer services, nursing and midwifery, diabetes, cardiac health, stroke, a range of allied health professions and many other areas.
