The role will improve Divisional performance by applying data analytics to appropriate data sets and finding opportunities to innovate in relation to timetabling and infrastructure planning.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Critically analyse large volumes of complex quantitative and qualitative data using spreadsheets, pivot tables and data
 visualisation tools such as Tableau and Power BI, and prepare reports and visual materials that 'tell the story' of the
 data analysis to inform better decision making.
- Contribute to the planning and production of the University timetable, including analysing University data to provide optimal clash protection for timetables.
- Assist with the integration of the University timetabling system with other University systems, including data collection procedures, as required.
- Take an active role in the ongoing development, implementation and maintenance of data warehousing and
 information delivery systems for servicing the information needs of the planning, management and reporting
 functions of the Timetabling Unit.
- Prepare data and analysis as required to inform relevant planning and reporting documents for the Division.
- Ensure the accurate maintenance of documentation for information delivery systems, databases and planning models as appropriate.
- Compile and produce complex statistical and other reports directly from University statistical databases and planning models, or any other available sources as required.
