

Role purpose

To deliver informative, yet engaging workshops that help students prepare for, cope with, and respond to an emergency. This role is instrumental in targeting our work towards people who may be more at risk from the impacts of emergencies

Role responsibilities

- Present approved disaster resilience education workshops to ages 8-10 (Years 3-4)
- Participate in relevant training sessions
- Travel to schools in a designated region
- Being punctual and organised at sites
- Pick up/return equipment and supplies to/from Red Cross offices as needed
- Report and document all incidents or service delivery concerns in accordance with Australian Red Cross' policies & procedures
- Immediately notify State or Territory Coordinators if you cannot attend your rostered session
- Support required monitoring, evaluating, and reporting for the Program
- Attend team meetings as required

Knowledge, skills, and experience

- Ability to engage with small and large groups of children and/or young people
- Willingness to teach new ideas and concepts, such as mindfulness activities
- Ability to problem solve and be flexible in the field
- Ability to be sensitive towards, and respond to, the diverse backgrounds, beliefs, cultures, and attitudes of members of the audience
- Basic admin skills and knowledge of Microsoft Office including email
