POSITION PURPOSE

The Research Development Manager utilises senior-level, specialist knowledge to oversee and deliver high-quality research services to facilitate the growth of BDI's research performance and foster a culture of research excellence.

The Research Development Manager is a critical liaison point between the BDI, the University, and various internal and external client groups. The BDI attracts more than \$70 million per year in research income across its 120 research groups, and the Research Development Manager works closely with internal partners such as the Heads of BDI's Programs to facilitate research support activities and alignment with the BDI's, the Faculty's and the University's research strategy.

The Research Development Manager performs and oversees a range of significant and complex research management activities that play a critical role in supporting the achievement of BDI's outcomes. This includes managing, overseeing and undertaking tailored and comprehensive grant review programs to ensure procurement of competitive research funding, with a particular emphasis on major schemes, including all NHMRC and ARC grant schemes, Medical Research Future Fund schemes and others across HERDC Categories 1-4. This includes providing one-on-one and group support to researchers for specialist grant schemes, reviewing applications to improve grant quality, and maintaining subject matter expertise in research management systems utilised by the University and by funding bodies.

- **6.** Manage a research support program which may include providing expert advice on, developing and contributing to; strategic documents and briefing papers, grant applications, reports, industry reviews, data analysis and other required documentation
- 7. Represent the Institute and contribute to marketing and business development opportunities with industry, business, government and the community, including working with others to realise funding opportunities, research collaboration, joint ventures and agreements
- **8.** Develop, pursue and maintain strong partnerships, collaborations and networks with academic and other staff, relevant research bodies, service providers and functional areas
- 9. Other duties as directed from time to time

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

- 1. The appointee will have:
 - postgraduate qualifications or progress towards postgraduate qualifications and extensive relevant experience; or
 - extensive experience and management expertise; or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and/or education/training

Knowledge and Skills

- 2. Broad knowledge of the research environment in Australia, including understanding of the assessment of research quality, presentation and methodology, and national and international funding opportunities available to Australian researchers
- 3. Excellent technical and general writing and editing skills with experience in drafting and editing reports and proposals and a well-developed understanding of effective structure and style to ensure high-quality, competitive funding applications
- **4.** Excellent operational management skills with proven ability to provide authoritative specialist and technical advice
- **5.** Demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a multidisciplinary team to develop new initiatives and deliver them to the research community
- **6.** Highly developed planning and organisational skills, with experience establishing priorities, allocating resources and meeting deadlines in a complex research environment

- 7. Highly developed analytical and conceptual skills including demonstrated ability to quickly assimilate new concepts and information and deliver positive, innovative solutions
- **8.** Highly developed interpersonal and communication skills with the ability to negotiate, influence and build consensus at senior levels
- **9.** Advanced computer literacy, particularly with current business management software packages and their various applications
