- Maintain appropriate boundaries with young people

- Communication and social skills with a demonstrated supportive and non-judgmental attitude
- Ability to build rapport and support young people from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to engage youth in a variety of activities
- Understanding of, and capacity to, respond appropriately to challenging behaviours
