Key Responsibilities and Outcomes

Operational

As either a Principal Planner or Engineer in the Integrated Transport Planning team with demonstrated expertise in integrated transport/traffic engineering aspects, multi-modal planning and network investigations you will:

- Provide advice on, and lead multimodal transport investigations into, matters pertaining to land use and strategic planning and private development, including but not limited to growth, investigation or priority development areas and the application of Council's Planning Scheme
- Proactively liaise and engage directly with both internal and external stakeholders, including with Council officers in Development Services (DS), Strategic Infrastructure Planning (SIP), Strategic Planning and Place-Making (SPPM) and relevant external state agencies or other authorities
- Lead in providing ITPD advice, input, assistance and guidance on strategic and policy matters including but not limited to Council's Planning Scheme, structure planning, Emerging Communities, road hierarchy, Integrated Transport Assessment, and emerging mobility/transport modes, trends and changes
- Review, draft or develop planning briefs/scopes, and when required manage consultants/projects, that are consistent with the key responsibilities of the role
- By undertaking those above, inform the currency/accuracy of Council's capital works and operational planning programs
- Apply Council's corporate and strategic objectives, including but not limited to the corporate plan, the Planning Scheme, the LGIP, Integrated Transport Strategy (ITS) etc.
- Respond to Councillor and Customer requests relating to your role and employ a range of verbal, visual and written communication techniques including where necessary community consultation and other external stakeholders
- Contribute to a positive team environment in order to achieve a high performance, continuous improvement and learning, and customer focused culture.
