Position Context/Purpose

Greater Shepparton Teaching Academies of Professional Practice (GS-TAPP)

The GS-TAPP is a cross-sectoral partnerships between a secondary school, primary schools and early childhood education centres in the Greater Shepparton area and La Trobe University and The University of Melbourne. The GS-TAPP aims to improve initial teacher education (ITE) and develop a pipeline of teachers into the Greater Shepparton area.

The GS-TAPP initiative aims to:

- deliver an immersive preparation experience for pre-service teachers
- test innovative approaches to ITE
- strengthen the links between theory, research and practice to enhance course effectiveness.

The Department of Education and Training Victoria has funded four existing Teaching Academies of Professional Practice (TAPPs) partners to undertake school-based research into preparation and placement approaches for teaching in rural and regional schools. The partnership of Latrobe University and The University of Melbourne has received funding for the research in 2022 and 2023 as part of the engagement with school partners and mentors. The Research Assistant on this project will work with a team of researchers from both institutions to complete this research.

Duties at this level will include:

- Conduct and publish, or otherwise disseminate high quality and/or high impact research/scholarly activities under limited supervision either independently or as part of a team.
- A comprehensive collection of data from pre-service teachers, mentors, centre and school leaders, parent groups and community groups.
- Attendance at meetings associated with research or the work of the unit to which the research is connected including the Department of Education, La Trobe University and The University of Melbourne (key partners)
- Acquire and interpret research data and results. Contribute to the development of models and methods and case studies.
- Undertake other duties and administrative functions commensurate with the classification and scope of the position as required by the Head of Department or Dean.
- Prepare reports and work with Project leads to ensure timelines and goals of the project are met.

Essential Criteria

Skills and knowledge required for the position

- Completion of a Bachelor's degree in the relevant discipline, and evidence of participation in higher level study relevant to discipline or professional area.
- Evidence of experience in research and evaluation and the ability to work effectively under limited supervision or independently.
- A record of contribution to publications, conference papers and/or reports, or professional or technical contributions which provide evidence of research potential.
- Experience in the analysis and modelling of data, including the capacity to integrate data from a range of sources and of uneven quality.
- Effective oral and written communication skills, including the ability to interact effectively with people from a diverse range of backgrounds.
- Demonstrated ability to work as a member of a team in a cooperative and collegial manner.

Capabilities required to be successful in the position

- Ability to demonstrate self-awareness, see things from another person's perspective and actively seek out and act on feedback to improve knowledge, skills and behaviour.
- Ability to work collaboratively, recognise the value of diversity and model accountability, connectedness, innovation and care.
