- Through our very successful General Education and Language courses, we teach students across UNSW. In 2022, 70% of headcount came from ADA, 11% from Science, 10% from Business, 5% from Engineering.
- Consistently in the top 1-5 Schools at UNSW for student experience scores in both Course and Teacher satisfaction.

Education Innovation:

- Working with UNSW Canberra we secured a contract to deliver language instruction in 30+ languages to DFAT officers in Canberra. Contract worth \$6M per year for 6 years.
- Working with Multicultural NSW, we developed a bespoke Short Course in Interpreting in 12 languages, from which 30 students (funded by MNSW) graduated in 2022; additional courses being offered in 2023..
- Secured a contract to provide training to 16 government officials and interpreters from Laos in preparation for hosting ASEAN summit in Nov 2024 - funded by DFAT through Laos-Australia Institute.
- We are working with the Gujaga Foundation of the La Perouse First Nations community to develop the first ever university-level course in Dharawal, the language of the Bidjigal and Gadigal people.






























Our Research

 Our research is unique in its multilingual diversity, both in terms of research areas explored, and the languages in which we publish outputs.



- We host the ARC Laureate Centre for History and Population, lead by Scientia Professor Alison Bashford.
- This Laureate Centre is also a partner in a Centre of Excellence bid which has reached the final stage of evaluation: ARC Centre of Excellence for Indigenous and Environmental Histories and Futures.
- ~30% of our R&T staff currently hold Cat 1 research funding (including Future and DECRA Fellowships).
- Our outputs and quality of outputs is increasing; our proportion of Q1 journal outputs has increased from 43% in 2021 to 60% in 2022.
- In the core humanities disciplines we continue to publish large numbers of high-quality books with major tier-one presses; these books regularly win significant Australian and international awards.

Our Social Impact & Engagement

- Languages Week 2022: multiple events on campus across 3 days: languagelearning, interpreting demonstration, dance, cosplay, calligraphy, music and food. More than 300 individual engagements on Day 1 alone. Included visit by Consular Officers from the Chinese Consulate of Sydney and a partnership with SBS television & radio.
- Films made by staff members have won Best Film awards at the Cannes World Film Festival two years in a row. One of these films, "The Bride Flights" (2022) has been seen by 100k+ people on free-to-air TV in Spain and is currently available on SBS OnDemand; this has led to several visits to the School by the Ambassador of Spain.
- Our researchers engage in multiple ARC Linkage, and other grants with partners across Australia and internationally on areas including:
 - disinformation and national security,
 - a just energy transition,
 - solar e-waste in Africa,
 - water management in Australia and Africa,
 - planning underground urban space,
 - equitable access to court interpreting services.
- Our researchers engage with and contribute to organisations and communities including First Nations peoples in Australia and the Pacific, migrant and refugee communities, disability advocates, the High Court of both the Northern Territory and Western Australia, and the Australian Defence Force.
- We have multiple collaborations with the State Library NSW, including hosting an online archive of oral history on Greek migration to Australia.
