This role will coordinate the Medical School's assessment functions for all courses and units including the MD program, articulating undergraduate major and postgraduate courses – including assessment methods, feedback and quality assurance.

Key responsibilities

- 1. Assessment Related Projects
 - Coordinate the planning, implementation, moderation and evaluation of summative and formative assessments in compliance with UWA Policy on Assessment and in conjunction with the relevant committees and staff.
 - Apply an understanding of research in assessment methods to keep the School informed of the latest developments in this area, and facilitate the development of appropriate innovative assessment methods within the School.
 - Provide advice to groups in the School on appropriate assessment tools to assess learning outcomes.
 - Be responsible for the production and dissemination of reports in a timely manner on the reliability and validity of individual assessment items, generic assessment methods and assessor protocols.
 - Develop staff guides for the use of assessment methods, and conduct related staff training.
 - Develop, update and maintain the Assessment Blueprint for the MD program.

- Establish staff development programmes relating to assessments, in conjunction with the School and Faculty Learning and Teaching Committees, other relevant curriculum committees and Education Designers and Technologists.
- Prepare reports and publications on assessment as directed by the curriculum and other committees and the Medical Education Unit.
- Oversee the development and maintenance of a database of assessment questions and assessment results.
- Liaise with Unit Coordinators, Chair of Medical Program Committee, Teaching and Learning Committees and the relevant University Departments regarding University regulations and requirements pertaining to assessment.
- Undertake library and archival work related to assessment and its evaluation.
- Attend and provide support in committee meetings as required.

2. Research

- Conduct research in collaboration with academic staff and relevant committees such as the writing, updating and editing of publications related to assessments and evaluation.
- Initiate and follow through on possible assessment and/or curriculum related research topics for publication and funding purposes.

3. Special Projects and other projects/tasks

 Assist at the direction of the Head of Medical Education Unit in curriculum development and special projects related to the School, Faculty and University priorities.
