POSITION PURPOSE

The Fellow will develop a program of research with industry organisations, to foster innovation in brain and mental health, and to promote career mobility between academia and industry. The Fellow is expected to work closely with an industry partner (or partners) to undertake applied collaborative research and to develop funding applications to support a world-class translational research program. The newly proposed ARC Industry Fellowship scheme could be one potential source of funding.

The position will contribute to the research priorities of the Turner Institute for Brain and Health in an area where they can demonstrate impact.

The Fellow will have access to career and proposal development to craft competitive funding applications, and a competitive start-up package.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Develop strategic partnerships with industry organisations to facilitate translational research
2. Conduct research as a member of a team and produce high quality publications
3. Preparation of competitive research proposal submissions to external funding bodies
4. Occasional contributions to the teaching program within the field of the Fellow's research expertise
5. Supervision of honours or postgraduate research projects within the field of the staff member's area of research expertise
6. Attendance at meetings associated with research and the broader Institute

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Education/Qualifications

1. The appointee will have:
 - A PhD in psychology or a cognate discipline.

Knowledge and Skills

2. Experience in engagement with industry partners, leading to tangible research outcomes
3. Familiarity with funding schemes to support industry-academic collaborations and research programs
4. Experience coordinating and facilitating translational research studies
5. Demonstrated capacity to produce high quality refereed publications, relative to opportunity
6. Demonstrated trajectory of ability to lead an independent program of research
7. The ability to work both independently in a research environment and as part of a cross-sector (industry-academic) research team
8. High level organisational skills and ability to meet deadlines
9. Excellent written and oral communication skills
10. A demonstrated capacity to work in a collegiate manner with other staff in the workplace
