#### **Role purpose**

Work alongside other volunteers to present interactive and educational workshops that talk to school students and community groups about the asylum seeker journey and the reasons why people seek protection in Australia whilst promoting compassion, harmony and social cohesion in line with Red Cross Strategy 2020.

#### **Role responsibilities**

- Attend presentations in schools with the In Search of Safety team.
- Attend any relevant training.
- Respond to questions about seeking asylum in Australia during the presentation.
- Encourage students to interact positively and meaningfully during the presentation.
- Contribute to the program evaluation.

#### **Knowledge, skills and experience**

- Comfortable speaking in public and to large groups of young people.
- Ability to travel to workshops across Adelaide metro and regional areas

#### **Check requirements**

- A National Criminal History Check prior to commencement and renewed every three years (Red Cross will arrange this)
- South Australian Working with Children's Check.

#### **Learning and development**

- Complete Red Cross online learning modules as required
- Attend Red Cross Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required

#### **General conditions**

We are a Child Safe organisation and all volunteers are required to comply with relevant State and Territory legislation requirements
