## JOB SPECIFICATION

### Primary Objective(s) of role:

The Bariatric Fellow will be professionally responsible to the Head of Department for each general surgical unit staff specialist. The position requires an ability and willingness to work closely with all medical, nursing and allied health staff. While working in the ward and other areas such as theatres and the endoscopy unit, the general surgical registrar is expected to work within the day-to-day operational rules of those areas

### Key Relationships / Interactions:

#### Internal:

- > This position is accountable to the general surgical units at Flinders Medical Centre. The main focus of the position is to be on-call as a senior registrar with either one of the general surgical sub-specialty units. There will be a particular focus on bariatric surgery.
- > The position is accountable to the Director of the Surgery and Perioperative Medicine Division, through the Department Head, for the provision of high quality care to patients in the wards, investigational and procedural areas, emergency department and outpatients.
- > The Bariatric Fellow's main focus will be elective weight loss surgery operations under the supervision of a bariatric surgical consultant. All cases require consultant involvement prior to surgery occurring. A component of training will occur in the private sector assisting consultant staff.
- > The Bariatric Fellow is expected to be a key part of the junior medical team on the ward. Expectations include:
  - > Daily registrar ward-rounds when on call with general surgery
  - > Availability to the Resident and Intern at all times when on ward rounds and in theatre
  - > Presence at Consultant Post-Take Ward Rounds
  - > Senior Registrar (level of on-call determined after two months) on-call commitments with either the HepatoBiliary or Oesophago-Gastric Units
  - > Post-graduate Education and Training

- > The General Surgery Research Registrar is expected to participate in the education and training of the junior medical staff and to participate in undergraduate clinical teaching when required.
- > With respect to their own training, is expected to;
- > Present regularly and participate in the Surgical Registrar Journal Club.
- > This is a monthly meeting and attendance and participation is required.
- > Present a topic of interest in Surgery every 6 months as part of the Monday morning Joint Weekly GI Services Meeting.
  
- > Clinical Practice Improvement Program and Audits
- > The Surgical Division is committed to the concept of clinical practice improvement. The Bariatric Fellow is expected to gain an understanding of CPI principles during their term at FMC.
- > It is expected that they will
  - Participate in CPI projects where required
  - Ensure accurate data entry into the Unit audit, including presentation of all deaths
