Position Overview

The Australian Centre for Excellence in Antarctic Science (ACEAS) is one of Australia's leading Antarctic and Southern Ocean research organisations. Based out of the University of Tasmania, and spanning seven universities across the country, ACEAS works to understand climate risks emerging from East Antarctica and the Southern Ocean. Our team numbers about 150 researchers and our work spans scientific laboratories, Antarctic fieldwork, and computer-based analysis.

The Communications Officer will coordinate communications of ACEAS under the broad direction of the Director in order to enhance the visibility of ACEAS research and researchers. The Officer will lead the planning and development of news, web, and social media stories focused on ACEAS research and researchers, including pre-planning and delivery of stories covering Antarctic fieldwork activity. The Officer will also oversee and edit briefing documents for policymakers and lead training of ACEAS staff in science communications.


