Primary Purpose:

In accordance with hospital policies, procedures, and statutory regulations, the Staff Specialist - Neurosurgery will:

- Provide clinical services of the highest possible standard to neurosurgery patients.
- Actively pursue improved outcomes for Neurosurgery Inpatients by participating in teaching and research relevant to neurosurgery.

Duties:

- 1. Provide services in neurosurgery including diagnosis, treatment, and care for patients, both inpatient and outpatient, at the Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH), and where appropriate, other hospitals in Tasmania.
- 2. In consultation with other clinical services, assist with the management of the RHH patients.
- 3. Participate in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching programs.
- 4. Undertake research in neurosurgery.
- 5. Participate in Hospital committee and administrative matters as required by the Chief Executive Hospitals South, Clinical Director Surgical and Perioperative Services or Head of Department.
- 6. Participate in continuous quality improvement activities.
- 7. Actively participate in and contribute to the organisation's Quality & Safety and Work Health & Safety processes, including in the development and implementation of safety systems, improvement initiatives, safeguarding practices for vulnerable people, and related training.
- 8. The incumbent can expect to be allocated duties, not specifically mentioned in this document, that are within the capacity, qualifications and experience normally expected from persons occupying positions at this classification level.

Key Accountabilities and Responsibilities:

The occupant of the job will work under the broad direction of the relevant Head of Department, and will:

- Provide a high-quality service, under the direction of the Clinical Director Surgical and Perioperative Services and Head of Department, to patients of the RHH by:
 - a) Providing appropriate clinical care to patients
 - b) Coordinating the follow up care of patients
 - c) Attending inpatients rounds and consulting clinics as scheduled
 - d) Ensuring effective communication with care providers, especially General Practitioners, to promote continuity of patient care.
- Demonstrate a commitment to continuous services improvements by:
 - a) Participating in the development of clinical guidelines and protocols
 - b) Attending and participating in clinical and departmental meetings



- c) Participating in departmental peer review and audit activities
- d) Continuously reviewing existing practices and promoting change where required
- e) Participating in Risk Management and Quality Improvement programs undertaken by the RHH
- f) Participating in College-based programs directed towards maintaining the highest standards of professional care.
- Demonstrate a commitment for personal and professional development by:
 - a) Attending conferences to maintain and enhance knowledge
 - b) Participating in programs designed to provide personal growth and development
 - c) Participating in personal performance appraisal.
- Demonstrate a commitment to a provision of a multidisciplinary approach to clinical care by:
 - a) Working harmoniously will all members or the clinical team
 - b) Being responsive to the expectations and needs of both clinical and non-clinical colleagues.
- Engender a consumer focus in service delivery by:
 - a) Ensuring consumers can exercise their rights and responsibilities.
 - b) Ensuring that patients and families are given adequate information upon which to base treatment decisions and follow up.
- Provide appropriate support, direction and training to trainee medical officers, nurses, and medical students, in liaison with the Professor of Surgery, University of Tasmania by:
 - a) Providing appropriate direction and supervision to Registrars, Resident Medical Officers, and Interns.
 - b) Acting as a role model and mentor for trainee medical staff, nurses, and medical students.
 - c) Participating in the education of trainee medical staff, nurses, and medical students.
- Participate in and contribute to academic life of the Department by:
 - a) Conducting research.
 - b) Participating actively in postgraduate educational activities e.g.: Grand Rounds
 - c) Contributing to the supervision of postgraduate students.
- Promote and contribute to the maintenance of a safe working environment by:
 - a) Complying with Work Health and Safety (WH&S) and welfare policies and other written arrangements for Work Health and Safety, and welfare at work.
 - b) Participating in relevant WH&S and welfare at work programs.
 - c) Complying with any reasonable instruction and following safe-work practices in relation to WH&S and welfare at work.
 - d) Participating in training programs and on-the-job training programs for WH&S and welfare at work.
 - e) Reporting all incidents, accidents and observed hazards to their supervisor or manager as soon as possible and assisting in the investigations process.
 - f) Supporting the role of the health and safety representatives by keeping them informed of any issues relating to WH&S and welfare at work.



- g) Ensuring that you are not, by the consumption of alcohol or a drug, in such a state as to endanger their own health, safety at work or the health and safety of any other person.
- h) Participating in appraisals to evaluate WH&S performance.
- Champion a child safe culture that upholds the *National Principles for Child Safe Organisations*. The Department is committed to the safety, wellbeing, and empowerment of all children and young people, and expect all employees to actively participate in and contribute to our rights-based approach to care, including meeting all mandatory reporting obligations.
- Where applicable, exercise delegations in accordance with a range of Acts, Regulations, Awards, administrative authorities and functional arrangements as mandated by Statutory office holders including the Secretary and Head of State Service. - Comply at all times with policy and protocol requirements, including those relating to mandatory education, training and assessment.

Pre-employment Conditions:

It is the Employee's responsibility to notify an Employer of any new criminal convictions during the course of their employment with the Department.

The Head of the State Service has determined that the person nominated for this job is to satisfy a pre-employment check before taking up the appointment, on promotion or transfer. The following checks are to be conducted:

Selection Criteria:

- 1. Demonstrated ability to manage patients within the discipline of Neurosurgery.
- 2. Demonstrated ability to work with a multidisciplinary team of medical, nursing, and health professional staff.
- 3. Demonstrated capacity for undergraduate and postgraduate teaching.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to undertake and manage research activities.
- 5. Proven ability to communicate effectively and maintain good interpersonal relationships in dealing with patients, their relatives, and professional colleagues.
- 6. Knowledge of continuous quality improvement activities relevant to practice with the clinical discipline.
- 7. Evidence of ongoing participation and commitment to continuing medical education.
- 8. Ability to function in an administrative capacity within a Hospital Department.
