Benefits of working at Deakin

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Overview

The Research Assistant will support the Theme Lead of Mental Health and Neurosciences in expanding and enhancing the HeSANDA Mental Health Node (see below). The incumbent will contribute to the addition of trials and metadata enhancement, outreach activities to mental health researchers, and the development of a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for data sovereignty and sharing data involving Indigenous individuals. Additionally, the Research Assistant will assist in data sharing infrastructure. Other responsibilities include conducting interviews and surveys, qualitative and quantitative data analysis, and engaging with Indigenous communities and researchers for the development of the SOP.

The Research Assistant will conduct various activities to support the Theme Lead of Mental Health and Neurosciences, including the addition of trials and metadata enhancement and outreach activities to mental health researchers, and assisting with psychosis research.

The HeSANDA initiative will deliver the infrastructure to enable the creation of a national health data asset that supports the sharing and reuse of health research data. The HeSANDA Mental Health Node is one of nine 'nodes' supported nationally by the Australian Research Data Commons. The Mental Health node will work in close collaboration with the Secure Heath Data and Biosample platform (SHeBa), a state of the art platform for discovering, combining, accessing and analysing data and biosamples collected by health services, research groups and other custodians. The HeSANDA Mental Health node and SHeBa aim to accelerate research to improve the health and wellbeing of people in Australia and internationally by enabling clinicians and researchers to find, request, and work with de-identified health data and biosamples on a single, secure platform. This will enable secondary use of data to maximise the outputs and impact of already collected mental health data.

The Mental Health node is based at Deakin's School of Medicine. Deakin's School of Medicine is recognised in Australia and internationally for its teaching, training, research and service to its communities. The Research Assistant will working as part of the Institute for Mental and Physical Health and Clinical Translation (IMPACT).

Responsibilities

- Conduct interviews and surveys with data custodians, mental health researchers, and other stakeholders.
- Liaise with clinical trial researchers to expand the available metadata.
- Collect and analyse qualitative and quantitative data, including questionnaires and interview transcripts.
- Support the development of the interface between the SHeBa and HeSANDA initiatives.
- Liaise with mental health researchers, relevant departments in Mental Health, staff from multi-disciplinary teams, consumer groups, external facilities/community agencies, and general practitioners about data sharing and the HeSANDA initiative.
- Engage with Indigenous communities and researchers for the development of the SOP.
- Monitor and reporting of adverse events and other major reporting requirements.
- Assist the research team with preparation, review, and maintenance of study documentation, including but not limited to, ethical and other governance and regulatory documentation; study protocols; standard operating procedures and training manuals; and any other relevant documentation.

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- Maintain strict standards of confidentiality and conforming to GCP guidelines and National Health and Medical Research National Statement on Ethic Conduct in Research Involving Humans standards in all activities.
- Participate in Quality Assurance procedures related to the project and service.
- Assist in the development and implementation of outreach activities to mental health researchers.
- Contribute to the development and enhancement of the Health Data Australia catalogue and metadata.
- This is a multi-faceted role and there is scope to also include other administrative duties.
- Remain up to date with current literature and methods relevant to the area of responsibilities.
- Attend meetings associated with the research project(s) regarding data sharing, outreach activities, and SOP development, such as Institute / School meetings or with funding partners.
- Ensure effective communication and liaison with other staff within the Centre, Department, Hospital, and other collaborating groups, including Indigenous communities and researchers, AEPCC, and MAGNET researchers.
- Attend appropriate staff development courses as the need arises and participate in the University's Performance Planning and Review Program.
